This Certification must be reviewed and updated once every permit term, or within one (1) year of substantial changes to a facility's operations which could reasonably contribute to stormwater pollution. Any newly constructed/acquired facility must be assessed within one (1) year of initiating operations at the facility.

A facility's GHP must be amended and reissued to the facility within one (1) year of any changes to the facility's GHP Applicability Certification.
